

Teacher Mini-Grant

Background

Cedarwood Children's Foundation's mission is to enhance the lives of St. Tammany Parish of Louisiana's children and to strengthen the community as a whole, now and into the future.

Through a simple grant process, Preschool through 7th grade teachers can apply for grant funding to provide enriching academic experiences in their classrooms. Teachers can apply for a maximum of \$250 per calendar school year, per request.

Our objective is to encourage and support teachers who have great ideas for creative use of curriculum that will provide enhanced learning experiences for students. Mini-Grants enable the purchase of special materials and resources for the classroom and are intended to support projects that are not provided for within school budgets or through other means.

All grant recipients are expected to report on the expenditure of grant funds and results of the supported projects no later than thirty days after intended use of the grant. Failure to report full accounting of expenditures and follow up questionnaire by this time may result in full repayment to the Cedarwood Children's Foundation for the approved amount of the grant by the recipient.

Funding Priorities

We recognize that students come from different backgrounds, have different learning styles, and can benefit from creative learning opportunities. We recognize that some students learn best with a 'learn by doing' model. We encourage you to consider: *Innovation, Impact, Planning*, and *Existing Resources*.

Innovation: Creativity of project; innovative approach; academic objective within curriculum context.

Impact: Potential to improve student achievement; potential for continuation and/or replication; potential to enhance instructional skills.

<u>Planning</u>: Clear plan for project implementation; teacher capability; cost effectiveness; realistic budget.

Existing Resources: Grant funding will not supplant existing funding. Projects cannot be currently funded with existing school budget.



Who Can Apply?

Teachers who teach in grades Preschool-K-7 are encouraged to apply. No more than one grant will be awarded per teacher, per school year. The Foundation will seek to provide grant funding across the programs between preschool, elementary, and middle school. If you aren't funded the first year, we encourage you to request funding the following year.

Application Timeline

Applications will be open and reviewed by committee members selected by the Cedarwood Children's Foundation Board members on a rolling basis until May 31, 2021. Grants will be awarded to those selected by the Committee for the current school year by May 31, 2021.

Number of Awards

The Cedarwood Children's Foundation will award a maximum of 20 mini-grants during the 2020 - 2021 school year.

What will not be Funded

Requests can be made for any resources which will help students learn, but the project must adhere to the following guidelines:

- 1. All requested resources must be used by students or directly provide a student experience.
- 2. The proposal cannot foster discrimination or promote a religious or political viewpoint.
- 3. Costs of labor, capital improvements to the school, classrooms, or grounds, or royalty/rental fees may not be requested through the Cedarwood Children's Foundation Teacher Mini-Grant program.
